### biography

In 1989 five Spanish musicians created an eclectic and innovative project that they have been developing over some years in different fields: music performance, education and creation. Today they tour all over the world, with courses intended for chamber music and recordings. In 1996 they won the First Prize in the "Ville de Narbonne" (France) 6th **International Competition for Brass** Quintets, considered the event of greatest prestige for this ensemble. In 2017 the group received the I Bankia Music Talent Award in Spain, as the most influential musical artists, and in 2019 they received the Espai Ter de Musica of Torroella de Montgrí Award for the project Mira si hem corregut terres...

The group has **four Carles Santos Music Awards** from the Institut Valencià de
Cultura, for their CDs XXX, Mira si hem
corregut terres., Les Aventures de
Monsieur Jules and Spanish Brass (a)
LIVE...

Their repertoire is one of the most thought-out carefully crafted aspects of their performances, along with the staging. Some of their shows that are worthy of mention are: Spanish Brass (a) LIVE, XXX and viBRASSions (brass quintet), Metàl·lics, Brass Brass Brass and Un po' di Fellini (educational concerts); Brassiana (with jazz trio), Make a Brazz noise here (Tribute to F. Zappa, with drums and guitar) or The Adventures of Monsieur Jules (with pianist Albert Guinovart); Mira si hem corregut terres...

(with Carles Dénia), Puro de Oliva (with flamenco-jazz pianist Chano Domínguez) or Paths of Spain (with flamenco dancers, guitar and percussions). They regularly cooperate with artists of such international renown as Christian Lindberg, Ole E. Antonsen, Michel Becquet or Kenny Wheeler and other groups as Amores Grup de Percussió or the Orfeó Valencià Navarro Reverter.

Spanish Brass is also committed to the development and creation of new forms of music, working with both famous composers and with young people of great influence. They have premiered around 100 pieces, most of them dedicated to the quintet, by composers like José Luís Turina, Jesús Villa-Rojo, Maurice Jarre, Vladimir Cosma, Fernando Palacios, Antón García Abril, Juanjo Colomer and Vicente Roncero, among others.

Spanish Brass performs concertante works with orchestra, a major one of these being the first performance in Europe of Karel Husa's Concert for Brass Quintet and Strings. They gave also the first ever performance of Couleurs du Temps of renowned composer Maurice Jarre; the premiere of La Devota Lasciva, composed by Juanjo Colomer; Concert for brass quintet and orchestra composed by Lluís Vidal with the Orquesta Nacional de España, conducted by Josep Pons; Guadalaviar, by Antón García Abril, with the Orquesta Filarmónica de Málaga, conducted by Edmon Colomer, and Brass Quintet Concerto, by Salvador Brotons, with


Orquesta Filarmónica de Gran Canaria conducted by Josep Vicent.

They have performed these pieces with the Orquesta de Córdoba (Spain), Orquesta de Radio Televisión Española (Spain), Orquesta Ciudad de Granada (Spain), Orquesta de Valencia (Spain), Orchestre de la Picardie (France), KBS Symphony Orchestra (Korea), Jove Orquestra de la Generalitat Valenciana (Spain), Joven Orquesta Nacional de España,..; and they have worked with conductors like Edmon Colomer, Josep Pons, Manuel Galduf, Salvador Brotons, Enrique G. Asensio, Shinik Hahm, etc.

Spanish Brass plays Shires trumpets and trombone, Paxman French horn, Melton tuba and Romera Brass mutes and mouthpieces; they use the new BlackBinder application. Spanish Brass uses BAGS instrument cases and are the owners of the BAGS company.

Chano Domínguez needs no introduction, his prolific international career representing flamenco is a quarantee of a complete artist in every sense, and SpanishBrass represents know-how in chamber music at its highest level.

After a meeting in Seattle (USA), where Chano attended a concert by the guintet, the necessary magic arose to create **Puro de Oliva**.

Chano has composed a new piece for brass quintet, piano and cajón flamenco entitled "Never Settle for the Oyster Light." The rest of the program includes other pieces by Chano including "Solo con verte," "Mi Prima de Riesgo," "De Cadi a New Orleans" and "Rumba Pa Jerry" that he composed for other artists such as Wynton Marsalis and Jerry Gonzalez and has now arranged for Spanish Brass, piano and percussion. All of which makes this show, entitled Puro de Oliva, the perfect ambassador for the music and culture of Spain.

A special quest artist is Chano's son, Pablo Domínguez, on the cajón flamenco.









Spanish Brass (a) LIVE is a show, which was later turned into a recording project, conceived in the midst of the pandemic, at a time of uncertainty when Spanish Brass felt the need to continue creating music and to vindicate the need for live music. With an eclectic repertoire, ranging from contemporary works to transcriptions of universal musical literature, the group aims to make audiences enjoy the magic of live concerts.

They have also received four Carles Santos Awards, and in 2020, they were honored with the National Music Award. They have released thirty recordings, including two DVD-CDs and three double CDs, showcasing their multiple talents. Every year, they organize two brass music festivals: the Spanish Brass Alzira SBALZ (www.sbalz.com) and the Brassurround Festival (www.brassurround.com).

Film music has been an auditory hallmark of contemporary culture since the birth of cinema. The melodies associated with images surround us, accompany our daily lives, and are unavoidable in our audiovisual world.

If film directors have become cultural icons, many composers have also played a significant role, with their names often inextricably linked to their work. Who doesn't recall Bernard Herrmann's soundtracks for Alfred Hitchcock's films? How can one imagine Sergio Leone's spaghetti westerns without Ennio Morricone's original soundscapes? How can we separate Steven Spielberg's world from the soundscapes created by John Williams?

This show aims to recreate some of the most characteristic moments of Federico Fellini's cinematography, forever intertwined with the music of Nino Rota, through the memories of Giulietta Massina, Fellini's wife and muse. Fresh, popular, and always surprising sounds will contribute to shaping one of the most personal of cinematic experiences.

#### Spanish Brass

Spanish Brass is one of the most dynamic and established quintets on the international music scene. In addition to participating in some of the world's most important festivals, they performed at the Prince of Asturias Awards ceremony in 1995 and recorded the music for the theatrical work "La Fundación" by Buero Vallejo for the National Drama Center and the soundtrack for the film "Descongélate" by Félix Sabroso for the El Deseo production company. In 1996, they won First Prize at the 6th International "Ville de Narbonne" Brass Quintet Competition in France, considered the most prestigious competition for this formation. In 2017, they received the I Bankia Award for Musical Talent in the Valencian Community, and in 2019, the Espai Ter Music Award.

Spanish Brass plays Shires trumpets and trombones, Paxman horn, Melton tuba, Romera Brass mouthpieces and mutes, and they use the Black Binder app. They also use instrument cases made by their own Bags brand. During these 35 years of career, Spanish Brass has been involved in creating a repertoire that did not yet exist, such as the one dedicated to the soloist brass quintet accompanied by orchestra. This has led it to commission and premiere around a dozen pieces by composers of the of pieces by composers of the stature of Juan J. Colomer, Lluís Vidal, Antón García Abril, Salvador Brotons, Abril, Salvador Brotons, Albert Guinovart and José Javier Peña Aguayo.

Spanish Brass has undertaken numerous commissions aimed at enriching the repertoire for brass quintets and bands. In this context, it's the shared courage to take risks and a commitment to excellence that serve as the defining hallmarks of these exhilarating and unforeseeable musical explorations.

Within the framework of this way of understanding music, we create a musical crossbreeding with very few references, where the strength of a music such as gospel, which is born in the depths of the soul, is embellished with the enormous richness of the timbre colours, virtuosity and elegance in the interpretation of the Spanish Brass quintet.
